The Transition Habitat Conservancy is delighted to report that the 987 Acre Grant Application for preservation in Piñon Hills has been submitted.

The Transition Habitat Conservancy has received an \$8,500 grant from Southern California Edison Company to further their work to conserve open untouched land for the present and future enjoyment of passive recreation.

The 2009 Spring Garden Party May 25th was a great success and between that and the Memorial Day yard sales, raised another \$2,500.

Two new directors have been added to the Board — Carol Hill and Bertrand Bays. A number of new members are also welcomed by the organization.
