Mission Statement

Protect regionally sensitive transition boundaries (mountain and high desert) to protect wildlife corridors and natural habitats by acquiring land and obtaining conservation easements to what is now private property for public hiking, horseback riding, educational and natural science studies.

Achievements in 2007 so far

- ♦ Preserved nearly 10 acres of land along the Mojave Desert/San Gabriel Mountain boundary. See photo to left.
- ♦ Received a grant of \$4,440 from the Community Foundation's Desert Legacy Fund Grant to support our 2007 outreach and education program.
- ♦ Applied for and were granted Partnership Agreement with National Parks Service- Rivers, Trails and Conservation Assistance Program for 2007.
- ♦ Received a grant donation from Edison International for 1 laptop and 1 desktop computer.
- ♦ Received scholarship and attended Land Trust Alliance's Land Preservation Toolbox course in Birmingham Alabama and attend this weeklong course detailing land preservation options.
- ♦ Continued our population study of

- ♦ Horned Lizards that began in 2006 as part of our Joint Resolution with the Horned Lizard Conservation Society to preserve habitat for these cool reptiles.
- ♦ We will fund preservation of 142 acres along the Mojave Desert/San Gabriel Mountain Boundary this year if all goes well with current collaborative land deal.
- ♦ Joined Land Trust Alliance to obtain expert land preservation training and the High Desert Resource Network to find funding sources from the community.
- ♦ Continue our efforts to identify and work with willing land owners to acquire land or implement conservation easements or other conservation measure to preserve wildlife habitat and passive recreational areas for future generations.

Transition Habitat Conservancy is a Pinon Hills based charitable non-profit organization created to preserve land for public open space parks beginning with our community. This public open space will help protect our native wildlife habitat and will be available to hikers, equestrians and students for educational purposes, field trips and general enjoyment. Future generations will have a place to study our unique desert to mountain transition dwellers like the horned lizard, Pinion Pines, kit fox, bobcat, coyote, leopard lizard, golden eagle and the many bird and plant species that are unique to our community.
